FACULTY ADMISSION CHECKLIST

Admission to the Counselling Programme requires the completion of the following: -

- Department of Psychology Supplemental Application
- Official Transcripts (Request transcripts from ALL colleges or universities attended or are attending).
- Curriculum Vitae or Professional Resume that provides information on previous Counselling or clinical experiences, educational honours, awards, professional interests, Christian service and Community involvement.
- Autobiographical Statement
- Three Letters of Recommendation from persons who are able to evaluate the applicant's professional, academic, and personal performance and the potential for success in a graduate programme.
- An Academic Writing Sample
- Ethical Professional Responsibility Statement
- A Department Admissions Interview

AUTOBIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT GUIDELINES

The following guidelines are provided as a guide to the effective writing of the applicant's personal autobiography. Admission to the Master of Arts programme in Counselling Psychology is contingent on the quality and completion of this admissions requirement. **The personal autobiography must be at least three to four pages in length and be consistent with the following guidelines:**

- a. Discuss your childhood development and early formation in your Family of Origin as they relate to your development of your value system.
- b. Incorporate at least two relevant life experiences that have contributed to the shaping of your personality and cognitive and emotional development.
- c. Discuss the evolution of your career development. Including any relevant professional experiences that you would bring to your chosen programme of study.
